22 members and friends attended the meeting on 7th November, at which subscriptions were collected. Caroline gave an update on the Angel Tree project, saying that the group had provided enough money to buy Christmas presents for five children whose fathers are in prison.

Julie Charles from Centre81 was welcomed as the speaker and she had chosen, as the Bible reading, the story of Jesus feeding five thousand people with a boy's picnic lunch. Julie talked about the two aspects of the work of Centre81. Whilst most people are aware of the Community Transport, she described the Skills and Activities Centre as Great Yarmouth's best kept secret. This has around 70 members and focuses on ability not disability, helping people to live fuller lives in a safe environment. The Centre opened in 1982 and the original buildings are no longer fit for purpose. The 'Pop in a £1, please' appeal has been launched to raise funds to enable relocation to a bigger and better place which can provide state-of-the-art facilities for everyone. It was an inspiring talk and ended with the singing of 'He's got Centre81 in His hands, He's got the whole world in His hands.'
